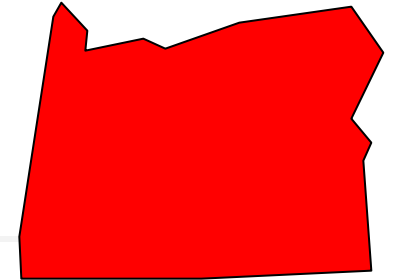

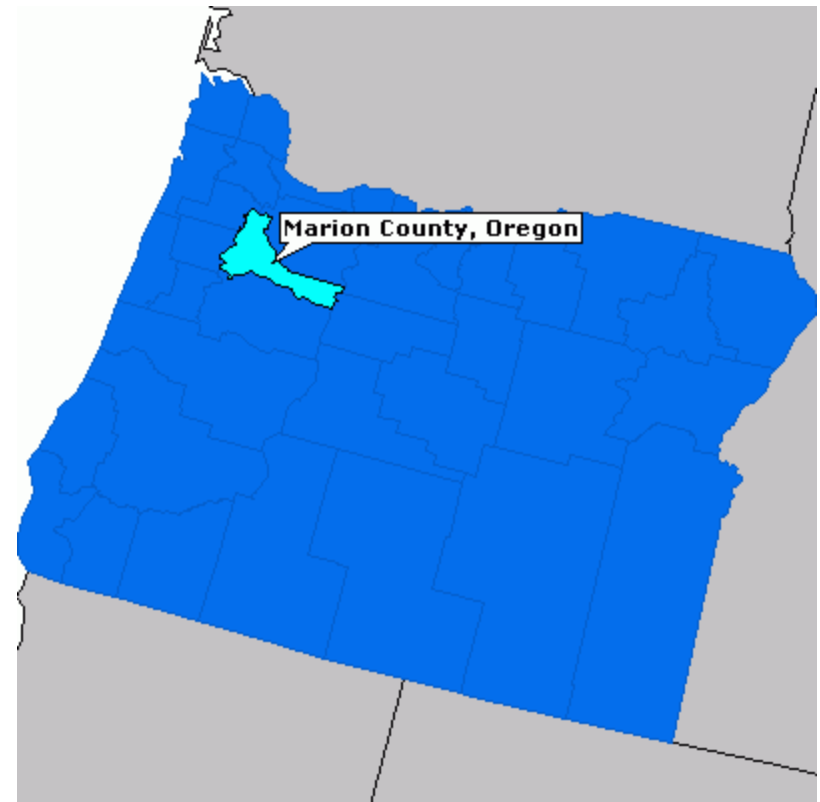

We are in Marion County...

- Includes Salem, Oregon's state capital
- Is about 50 miles south of Portland
- Has a fast-growing Latino population
- Latino's make up 17% of the county's population, compared to 8% statewide (2000 census)





Focus on Latino Families...

- 20% of people receiving services from Oregon Dept. of Human Services are Latino
- 13% of families with insufficient food in the Willamette Valley are Latino
- 13% of Marion County residents are living on insufficient income and have difficulty *meeting basic needs*
- 25% of families who sought domestic violence services in Marion County are Latino
- 10% of the school population in the Salem-Keizer and Woodburn School Districts are in special education
- 65% of students in Woodburn Schools receive ESL support
- 24% of Latino families do not have insurance coverage

Focus on Latino Families

- Significant barriers exist to services such as:
 - Language barriers
 - Cultural barriers
 - Significant basic needs



About Family Needs...



We thought about a lot of things...

- We considered what is already known about any family who has a child with a developmental disability.
- We considered Latino families' needs in general... whether or not the family has a child with a developmental disability.
- We considered the special needs of Latino families who have a child with a developmental disability.

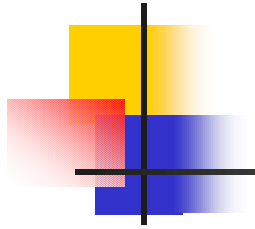
Health

Social Services

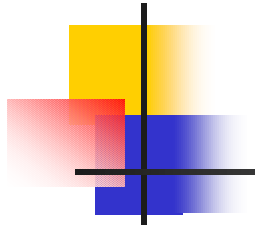
Applying for Social security benefits and knowing our rights

Help with basic needs like food, housing, utilities, clothing



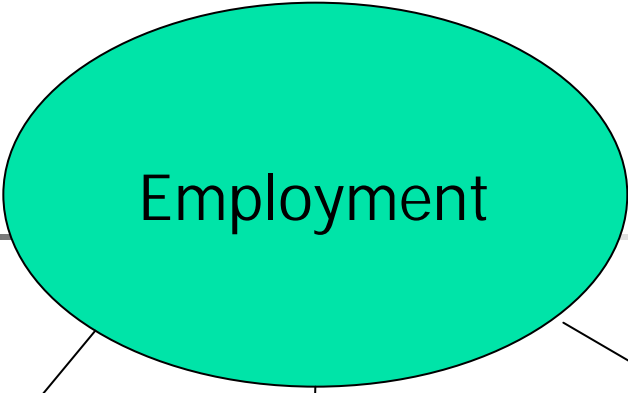
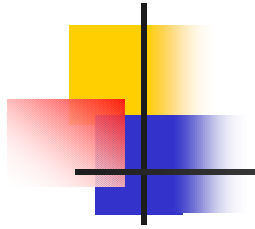

Juntos Podemos ...



- Our goal is to find new ways to support Latino families with a child with a developmental disability.
- We developed a center where families can go to get the services and support they need.
- It is a community effort, so we look to **EVERYONE** in our community for help.



What is *Juntos Podemos*?

- *Juntos Podemos* is a “one-stop center” for families who have a child or children with developmental disabilities.
- The center is a program of the Human Services Research Institute (HSRI).
- We are a family center that offers information, training and planning ~ but mostly, we CONNECT people ~ to the community and to each other.

A LITTLE BACKGROUND...

- This project is part of a larger federal effort funded by the U.S. Administration on Developmental Disabilities.
- ADD is testing new ways to support families... namely through its “Family Support 360” initiative.
- We were one of 30 states to receive a planning grant.
- We are one of 17 states with an “implementation grant.”
- We are 2 years into a FIVE YEAR effort.



Our Grant says we will...

The Human Services Research Institute is teaming with the members of the Oregon DD advocacy and services network to **design a One-Stop Center to assist poor, unserved and underserved families of children with disabilities** and address the problems that impede the self-sufficiency of these families in Marion County. We expect our actions will serve as a model for reform that can be implemented across the state.

Public Services
